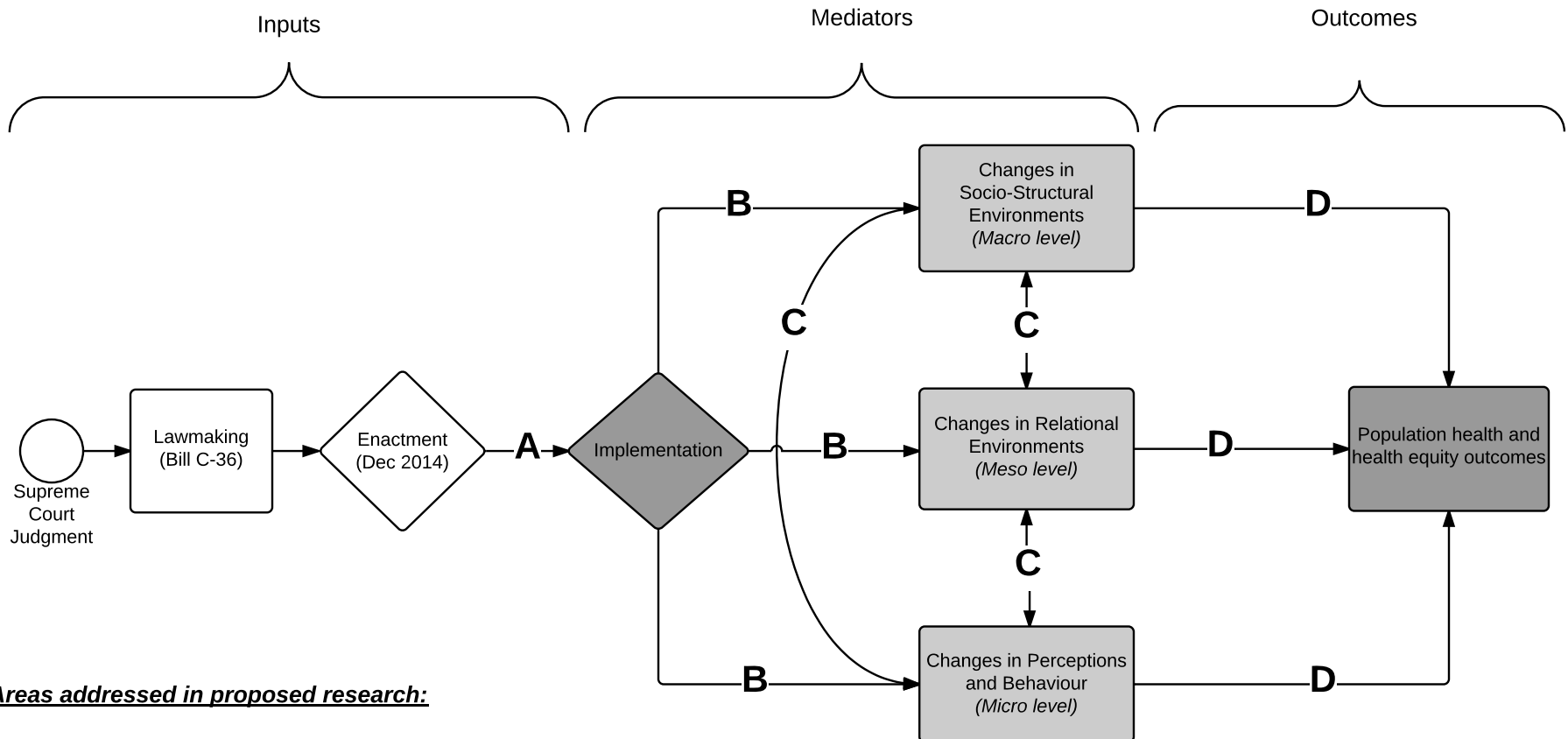


# Appendix A: Logic Model of PCEPA as a Health and Health Equity Intervention

## Areas addressed in proposed research:

- A)** Extent that the intervention (PCEPA) is implemented, namely:
  - i) Policing practices and policies;
  - ii) Prosecution and sentencing decisions;
  - iii) Knowledge & awareness of the laws relating to the sex industry (e.g., enforcement but also media coverage).
- B)** Mechanisms by which implementation of the law results in:
  - i) Behaviour or perception change at the individual or micro level (e.g., of sex workers, clients and managers);
  - ii) Relational changes at the interpersonal or meso level, including dynamics and power (e.g., between clients, sex workers, co-workers, managers, spouses and intimate partners, family members, community members, etc.), and qualities of the socio-spatial environments in which they occur;
  - iii) Socio-structural changes at the broader or macro level (e.g., services, institutions and structures).
- C)** Reciprocal effects of changes at the macro, meso and micro levels.
- D)** The impact of changes in behaviour, relational environments and socio-structural environments on population health and health equity outcomes.
